


St Bernadette's RC Primary School A BIG THANK YOU

Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves. Never give sparklers to a child under five. Buy fireworks marked BS 7114. Keep fireworks in a closed box. Follow the instructions on each firework. Light them at arm's length using a taper. Stand well back. Never go back to a lit firework. Never put fireworks in your pocket. Never throw fireworks.

Keep pets indoors.



Welephant says, "Read the Firework Code and use it!"

Stay safe this bonfire night by following Welephant's Firework Code.

As bonfire night approaches. Type and Wear Fire and Rescue Service would like to remind and warn local parents and young people of the dangers of fireworks.

Two students and one ex-student from the same school in the Tyne and Wear area have all sustained firework related injuries over the last few days.

Using fireworks in a public place is illegal, and carries an on the spot fine of £80.

Young people should be advised **never** to hold a lighted firework in the hand, or to throw fireworks.


