They do not know that some of you speak two languages or that you are an incredibly talented

musician. They do not know that you love to sing or have a natural talent for drawing. They have not seen your talent or flare for dancing or gymnastics. They do not know the pleasure you take getting lost in a good book. They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them, or that your laughter can brighten the dreariest of days. They do not know that you are a dedicated

sportsman or are a huge help at home with your little brother or sister. They do not know that you are kind, trustworthy, funny, thoughtful...and that every day you try to be the very best person that you can be.

So while you are sitting these tests, remember that in the midst of it all, there is no way to "test" all of the amazing and awesome things that make you, YOU!
