

#### Harvest Appeal 2019

Can your School donate its Harvest Festival collection to the Walking With project?

We provide support for Asylum Seekers and refugees who have fled from war and torture to find a safe place to live.

Our service users are often with us for many years only receiving £37 per week to live on, the need for food is ongoing.

Harvest donations are crucial for the project: they go a long way to provide support for our service users.

The numbers of people using the project have grown. We regularly feed 96 people (adults and children) per week.

Donations needed are:

Tinned: tomatoes, chickpeas, kidney beans, Sugar, Coffee, sweetcorn, fish, fruit and custard, basmati rice, dried pasta/spaghetti, oil, washing up liquid, washing powder, toilet rolls, cereal, biscuits and confectionary, shampoo, toothpaste, sanitary products, shower gel and fresh fruit and vegetables.




