Rauri has been having a fantastic time in Plessey Woods, climbing trees and having a beach party.



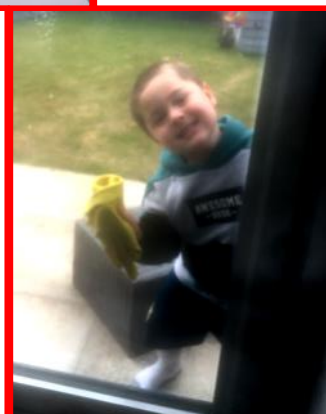
I can see Sophia is in the mood for Chelsea Flower Show this week with her beautiful paintings! Great work!!
