


Art/DT

Computing

This half term we will be using a range of apps during other subjects.

The focus in our computing lessons will be to make Multi media stories. This is a unit that gets children writing and creating stories and bringing them to life with sound and animation.

History/Geography

We will be looking at lighthouse and where they are situated around the country we will read the Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch and look at maps to identify features on our coast line that show the need for Lighthouses.

We will also be looking at the first lighthouse that was built in by the Romans and comparing it to a modern day lighthouse.

PE takes place throughout the week; please ensure your child has named PE kits in school on the correct days.

This half term we will be looking at the skills we need for Volleyball. Children will take part in different activities that will focus on skills such as mastering basic movements including running, jumping as well as balance, agility and coordination . Children are taught outdoor PE on Mondays by our sports coach, Phil Coates. They will be focusing on ball skills this term.

Educational visits and outdoor learning

We will be going on walks in and around the school to explore seasonal change as part of our science topic.


We will also be visiting the rising sun to be season detectives and look for signs of winter and spring coming.

Literacy

We will be looking at common features of fairy tales. We will use the book *Into the Forest* by Anthony Browne to create our own fairy tale called *Into the Toon*. We will also be entering the North Tyneside Writing Festival with the topic *Journeys*. We will write an explanation text about our inventions of the Lighthouse Keepers Lunch Box to explain how it works.

We will use the following skills to achieve this

- sequence sentences to form short narratives
- say aloud what they are going to write about
- use planning tools
- draft writing
- re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense
- discuss what they have written with teacher or peers.



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Maths

In maths we will be exploring division and multiplication. We will be recalling and using multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers.

We will be calculating mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (\times), division (\div) and equals ($=$) signs.

We will learn the rules which are to show that multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order and division of one number by another cannot.

We will be solving problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts.

Spelling,

Phonics, Grammar and Punctuation

We will be teaching the age expected spellings as well as revisiting phonic patterns and tricky words.

We will be exploring suffixes, past and present tense and the different types of sentences.

Across Key Stage 1 we will be continuing our daily phonics lessons. Children will work in mixed phonics groups and there will be ongoing assessment to ensure the children are accessing the relevant phonics programme.

Science

This half term we will be learning about **materials**

We will be looking at different buildings materials and experimenting with materials that can withstand a storm.

We will be revisiting **Seasonal Change** and looking at the changes in Winter.

Homework

In Key Stage 1 the children will have homework books which will include a note each week which sets out the homework and when it should be returned. The homework will focus on basic skills, number, handwriting and sometimes topic based activities.
