Literacy

We aim to take the children into the imaginary world of The Night Zoo-Keeper. This digital learning tool will inspire children to write through the use of fantastic imagery and online resources. Night Zookeeper is based around a selection of magical story books. These books introduce children to a world of possibilities and provide an inspiration for children to write. This half term, we will be learning to write:-Narrative—a one week revision of previous skills covered which will end in a written narrative linked to our key value of courage.

Non Chronological Reports and Newspaper Articles. Key objectives will be:-

Use simple organisational devices such as headings and sub-headings

Propose changes to vocabulary

Proof reading

Compose and rehearse sentences

Variety of sentence structures

Reading

This term we will be reading a variety of newspaper articles and non chronological texts. Where possible these texts will be linked to animals and zoos. Key learning objectives will be to understand that:Texts are structured in different ways for a range

Science

Living Things and Habitiats

Children will be taught to-

Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways

Explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment

Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.

History / Geography

In Geography we will be using maps to locate countries in Europe (including the location of Russia), concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics and major cities. We will look at geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of a region of the United Kingdom, a region in a European country. We will describe and understand key aspects of human geography.

Maths

Children will be given mathematical tasks based on our topic and the learning objectives we need to cover this half term. For example, they may be asked to identify errors in the zoo's accounts. They may be asked to work out the cost of feeding the different animals in the zoo or work out the perimeter of different animal pens. The children will be taught the key skills and then asked to apply them in different ways to show that they are 'masters' in maths. The key skills taught this term will be to:-

Recognise and show using diagrams families of common equivalent fractions
Find fractions of numbers
Add and subtract money involving decimals
Measure and compare lengths
Find perimeter of shapes

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG) will be taught within literacy lessons and straight after lunch as a quick fire 15 minute activity. Skills covered will be—

Pronouns

Expanded noun phrases

Apostrophes

Prepositional phrases

Use of direct and indirect speech

Commas after fronted adverbials

Our spelling focus will be

Common words, 'Big Words', suffix—ation, suffix ly, words with endings sounding like 'ure'

Art / DT

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We will be continuing to contribute to our sketch books to record their observations and to use sketchbooks to review and revisit ideas. We will be improving our mastery of art and design techniques, including painting, collage using a range of materials.

We will be learning about great artists in history. We will be using the ideas of European, surrealist artist Rene Magritte and linking these into our literacy work.
