Literacy

We will continue to focus on the theme of animals and use the Night Zoo Keeper as a theme. This digital learning tool will inspire children to write through the use of fantastic imagery and online resources. This half term, we will be learning to write:-

Poetry

We will be writing some performance poetry on the emotive topic of animal cruelty. We will end this unit with a poetry slam off.

Information Text

This will be linked to the science topic of 'States of Matter' whereby the children will be writing about the water cycle.

Key objectives will be:-

Use simple organisational devices such as headings and sub-headings Propose changes to vocabulary Proof reading Compose and rehearse sentences Variety of sentence structures

Reading

This term we will be reading a variety of Poems and Information texts. Where possible these texts will be linked to animals and zoos or States of Matter (linking to science). Key learning objectives will be to understand that:-

Texts are structured in different ways for a range of purposes

Writers have different viewpoints

Writing has an effect on readers and how the author does this

We can retrieve and record information from non fiction texts.

Science

We will continue with Living Things and Habitiats and then move on to States of matter which will be taught through Literacy.

Pupils will be taught to -

Compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.

Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C). Identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of evaporation with temperature.

History / Geography

We will be completing our Geography topic by comparing an European city with a city in the UK.

In history we will be studying who the Anglo Saxons were; where they came from and aspects of their daily life.

Maths

Children will be given mathematical tasks based on our topic and the learning objectives we need to cover this half term. They will be using their knowledge of multiplication and addition to work out the perimeter of different animal pens. They will also use all four operations to work with measures and the skill of conversion. The children will be taught the key skills and then asked to apply them in different ways to show that they are 'masters' in maths. The key skills taught this term will be to:-

Measure and compare lengths Find perimeter and area of shapes

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG) will be taught within literacy lessons and straight after lunch as a quick fire 15 minute activity. Skills covered will be— Pronouns Expanded noun phrases Apostrophes Prepositional phrases Commas after fronted adverbials Our spelling focus will be Common words from key stage 1 and setting nonnegotiables Endings -sion Endings spelt -tion, -sion, -ssion, -cian

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We will be completing our recycling sculpture work on the topic of 'awesome animals' identifying strengths and areas for development. We will be experimenting with different effects and textures with paint and colours to help create mood and emotion.

This half term we will be practicing skills which will enable us to play volleyball and basketball. The key objectives will be to-Play competitive teams games Understand the principles of attacking and defending

We will be focusing on Getting on a Falling Out. We will be learning to:
