Literacy

This half term the children will be looking at the courageous actions of characters in The Snow Queen story, through the dated language in fairy tales and film. The children will be writing instruction pieces based on the magical encounters as well as embedding inference and deduction.

Following this, the class will be exploring the natural world with a focus on Scandinavia and Lapland. Through group planning, research will form the basis of our explanation writing.

The key skills we will be covering to transform the children's writing will be:-

Similes and Metaphors

Structure and Organisation of information using paragraphs, headings, sub-headings and bullets points

Use of present tense and plurals

R.E.

Our topic this half term will be Community in the Local Church. The children will be looking the experience of community being an essential and enjoyable part of life.

We will know and understand the importance of unity and charity. Pupils will know and understand the mission of inspirational leaders, how the dioceses continue the work and mission of Jesus including ecumenism.

Pupils will acquire the skills of assimilation, celebration and application of the above.



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Reading

The children will be taught reading within basic skills lessons as well as daily focussed reading sessions. They will be taught the skills of comprehension, inference, text structure and organisation, language and themes using a variety of text styles and genres.

The children are encouraged to continue this at home, looking at a wide range of different genres.

Maths

This half term the children will be learning convert between units of length and weight; this is an extension of our multiplication and division topic.

We will be revisiting percentage and fractions of quantity. We will also be looking at how to order and compare fractions; recognise equivalent fractions and the way in which these can be applied outside the classroom.

We will learning how to add, subtract and multiply fractions. Where possible our lessons will be linked to our topic.

Children will be focussing on different vocabulary

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

After initial assessment to identify the children's strengths and weaknesses in this area we will be following the Year 5 curriculum objectives in this after with daily interactive fast paced basic skills activities. Spelling has been identified as a particular weak-

History/ Geography

This half term we will be looking at Scandinavia with a geography focus in mind. We will be looking at historical landmarks; places of interest and coastal areas. The children will also be drawing graphs to look at trends in data and climate change.

Art / DT

Whilst a handful of the children's homework tasks will have a Design Technology focus, the children will be looking at chalk drawing and blending to create the winter scenes depicted in our literacy text.

Following this the children will be looking at the famous Norwegian artist, Edvard Munch, whose use of pastels and paints heavily influenced German Expressionism in the 19th Century.

Throughout the year the children will be building a sketchbook of jottings and experimenting with different mediums as well as learning to analyse and evaluate their successes, strengths and weaknesses.
