#### Literacy

#### Year 6

Literacy this half term will have a real grammar focus. Through writing character descriptions, transcripts for movie trailers, and non fiction pieces, we will consider many grammatical aspects of writing.

We will be completing weekly writing units, with the end product being a shorter, extended paragraph as opposed to a whole genre of writing. This will enable us to concentrate on more complex areas of grammar and spelling, such as:

Active and Passive voice

Perfect, simple and progressive tenses

Personal, possessive and relative pronouns

Different types of phrases and clauses


Tricky spellings such as words with silent letters.

#### Year 6

In our maths lessons this half term we will revisit many of the areas already covered in this academic year. A real focus will be placed on arithmetic skills as well as fractions, problem solving, geometry and ratio.

We will be focusing a great deal on test technique in preparation for SATs, while revising all areas of Maths covered this year.

Reasoning and problem solving will be our focus during Maths lessons, whereas we will have daily arithmetic sessions in order to improve our basic calculation, fractions and percentages knowledge.

### Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

In addition to Literacy lessons with heavy grammar focus, we will have grammar lessons in the afternoon to consolidate all grammar covered this year.

Spelling will also be a huge focus, concentrating on common spelling patterns.


### History/ Geography
