Sport and PE take a very high precedence at St. Bernadette's and we are proud of our achievements. We provide a broad PE and Sport curriculum of games, gymnastics, dance, athletics and swimming.

After the success of the London Olympics the government announced that £450 million worth of funding would be available to schools over a three year period. The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

The aim of the premium is that all pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

St. Bernadette's were allocated £9335 in the academic year 2013/14. It was decided with the grant we would have the following priorities:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
